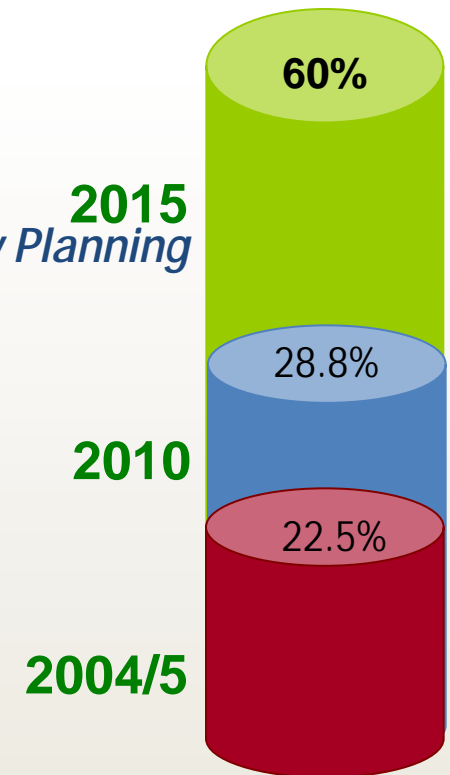

The National Road Map To Accelerate Reduction of Maternal, Newborn and Child Deaths in Tanzania 2008 - 2015



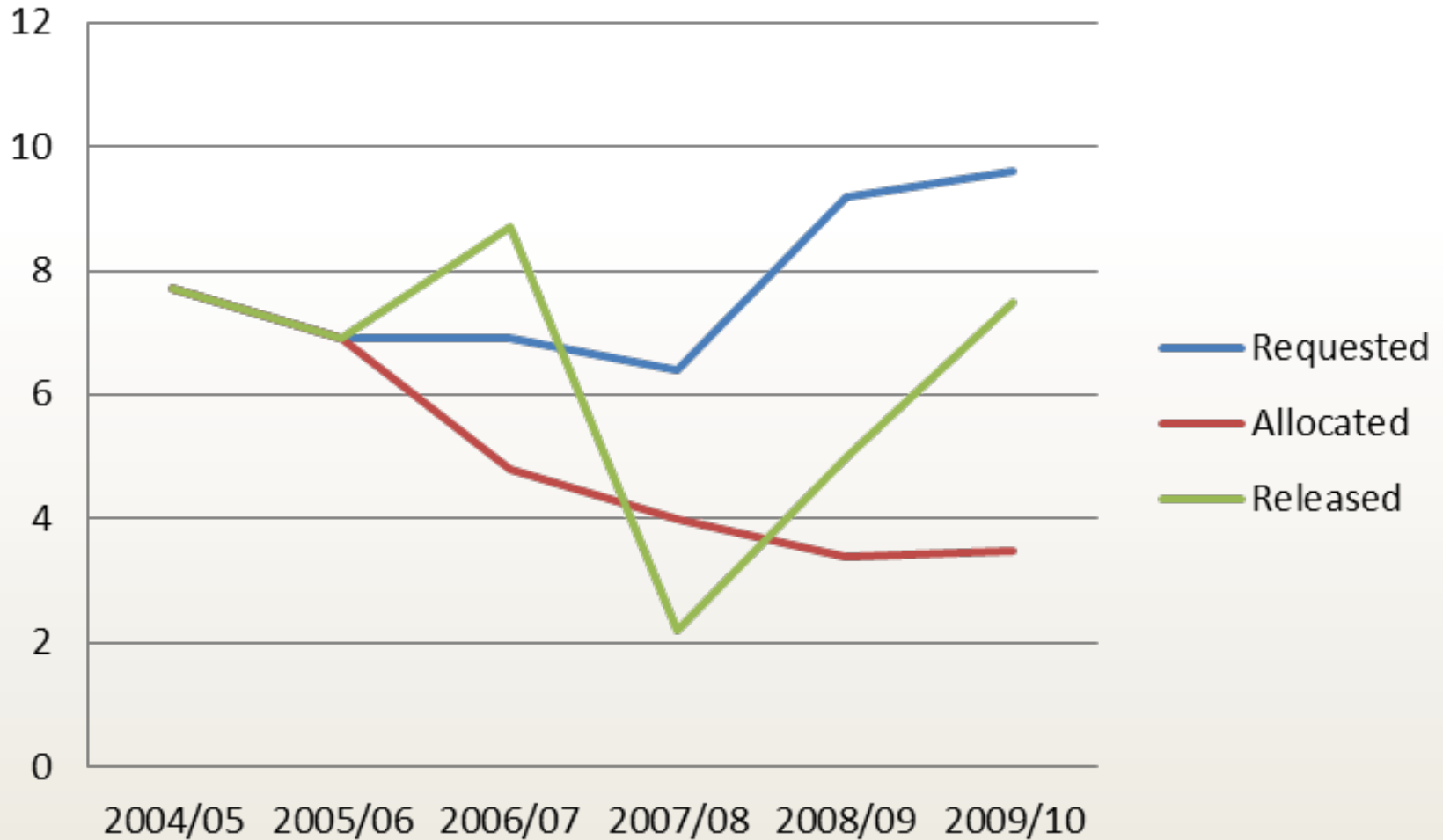

The Problem: Poor Financing for Family Planning

- Lack of a line item for FP in govt. budget
- Dwindling government allocations for FP
- Frequent Contraceptive Stock-outs
- Lack of coordination and accountability among stakeholders and with MOH

Declining Funding Trends for Commodities



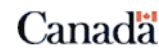
The Decision: Develop a Plan to Reposition FP

- **PROJECT:** Understand what it will take to get there
- **STRATEGIZE:** What needs to be done?
- **COST:** What will it cost?
- **ADVOCATE:** Achieve visibility in National Development Agenda/FP Budget Line Item
- **COORDINATE:** Systematic and Cohesive Effort
- **LEAD:** MOH in the driver's seat

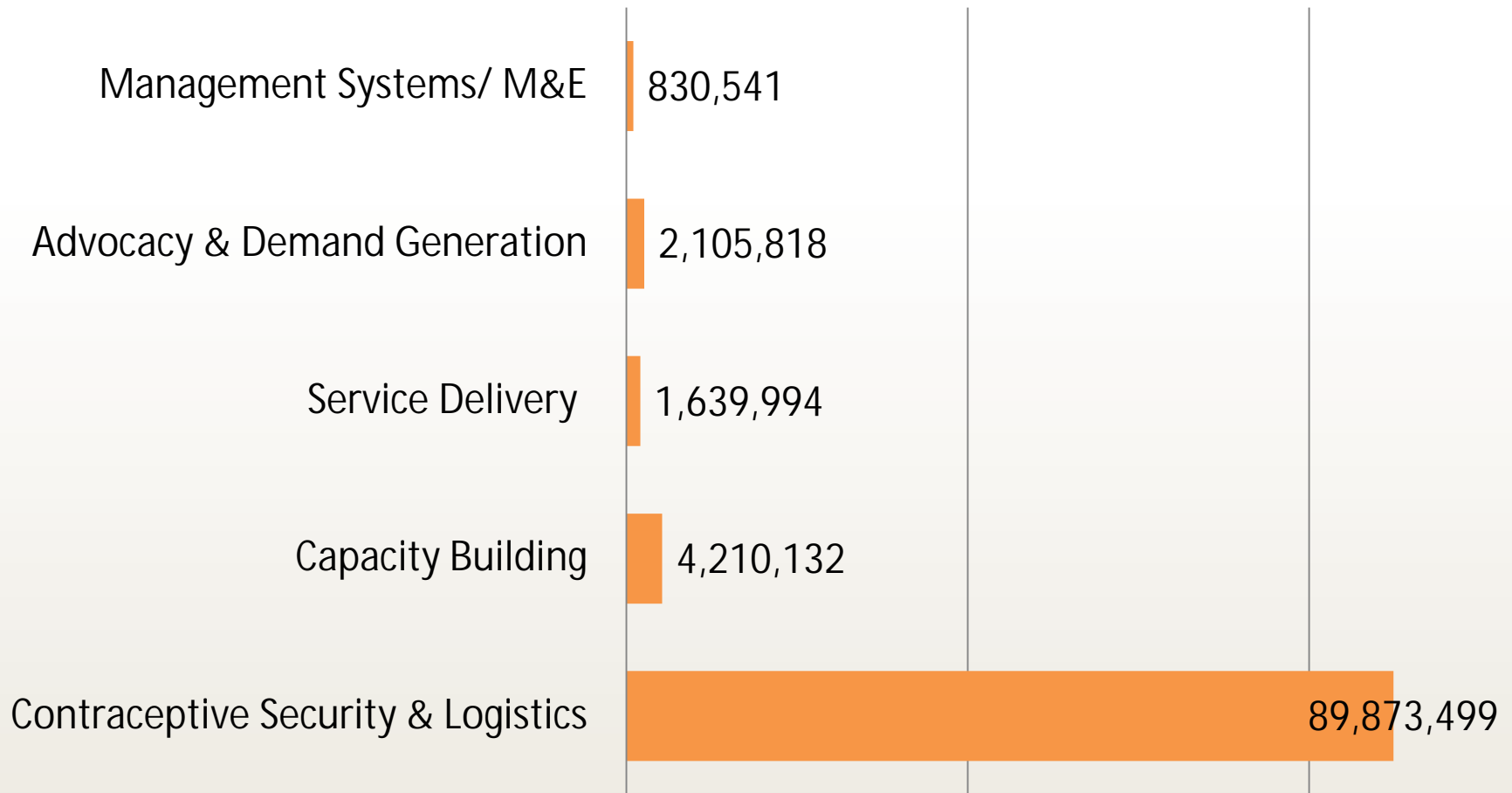

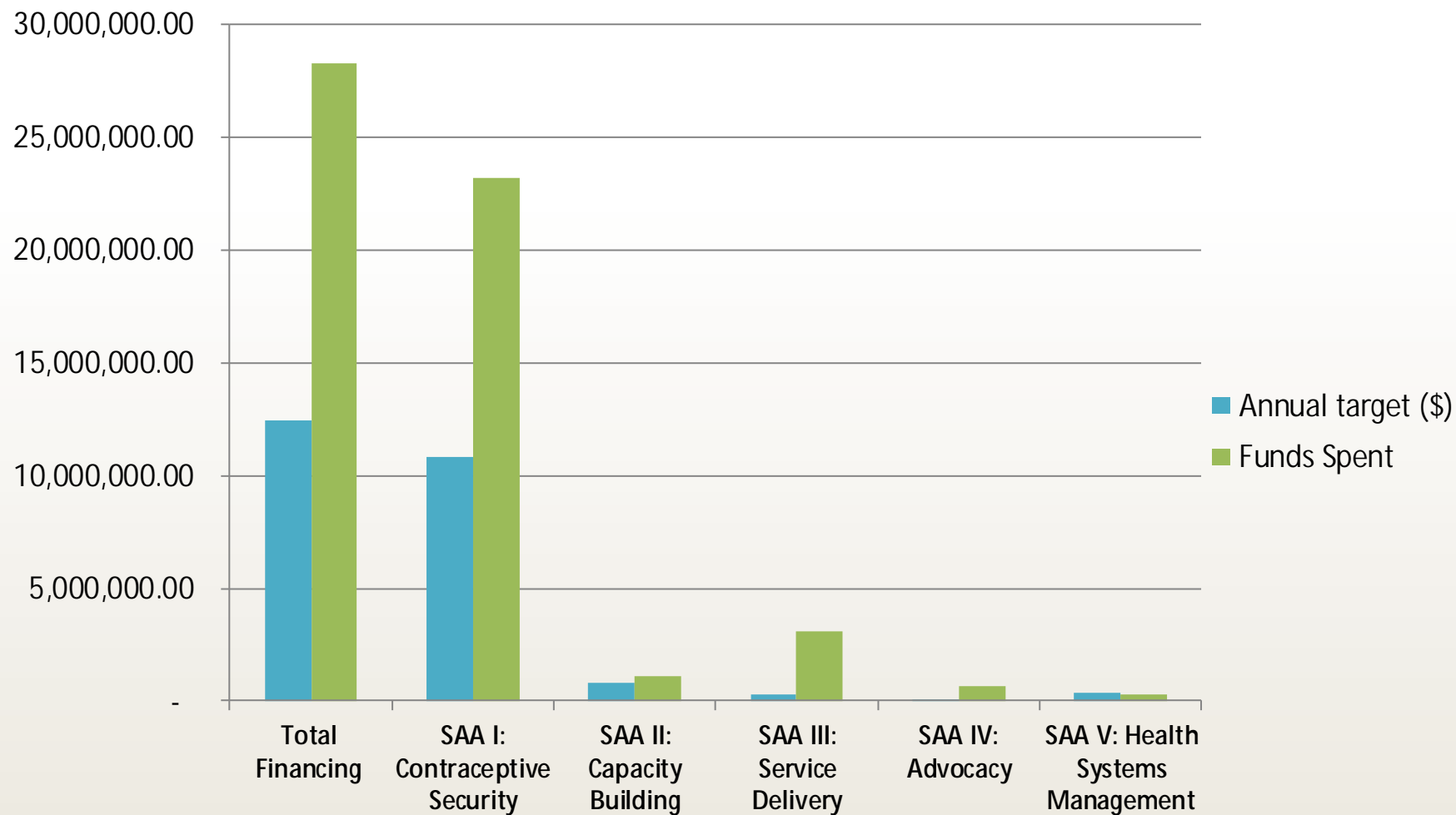

- ü Benchmark for monitoring progress

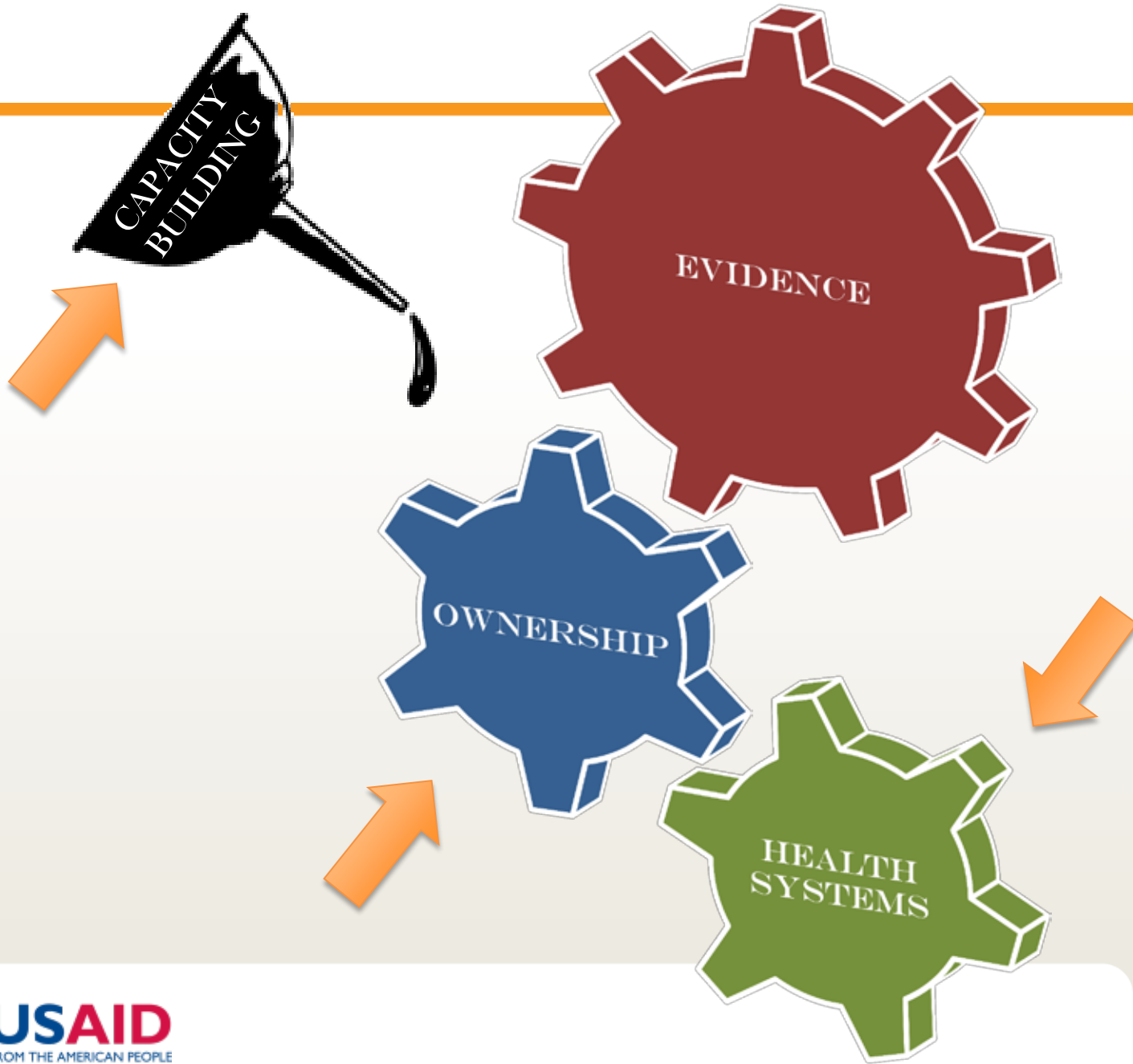


YR 1 Results: Overall Financing



Gains in Policy and Advocacy

- Integration of total fertility and population growth rate reduction targets in the National Development Plan (MKUKUTAI)
- Establishment of a separate FP Target (Line Item) in the current MoHSW MTEF
- Inclusion of the FP in council health planning guidelines, resulting in increase in FP resource allocations at district level
- Government “own” funding that has increased from 0.5bn TZ shillings (2010/2011) to 1.2bn TZ shillings (2011/12).
