### **PROGRESS Overview**


- Goal: Improving access to family planning services among underserved populations through research, research utilization, and capacity building
- Five-year (2008-2013) cooperative agreement
- Global technical leadership, focused activities in selected countries







# **Where PROGRESS Works**



# **Key Accomplishments: Funds leveraged**

- Core funds of \$26.5 million have been met with...
  - \$16.1 million in Field Support funds
  - \$2.5 million in NIH/IAA funds
  - 35 examples of funds leveraged, including from
    - Gates Foundation for Sino-Implant (II) and Depo-subQ in Uniject
    - Donation of contraceptive products for use in 4 studies
    - More than a dozen organizations supporting dissemination of m4RH in Kenya and Tanzania







# **Key Accomplishments: By the Numbers**

- 42 Research & evaluation studies in 12 countries
- 100+ Publications, including peer-review journal articles, reports, briefs, RU tools, and supported country guidelines
- 37 Major changes in program & policy
- 13 Capacity building partners, including 7 MOHs

# **PROGRESS Technical Areas of Focus, India**

### PPFP, focus on Immunization

- Assessment on FP-immunization integration
- Worked with Government of Jharkhand on SOPs, IEC materials, and training curriculum for providers

### **Expanding Method Mix**

- Research on Multiload-375 IUCD
- Rapid assessment of contraceptive doorstep program
- Research assessed DMPA acceptability & use among clients, provider perceptions and facility assessments







# **PROGRESS Technical Areas of Focus, India (2)**

### Non-Health Integration

Integrating FP information into microfinance organization, NEED

# **Cross-cutting RU & Capacity Building**

- Male involvement training and study
- Advocacy & information sharing: E-Forum, support to Advocating Reproductive Choices (ARC), others
- Promoted evidence-based tools & guidelines
