OUR PROGRAMS

Integrated Humanitarian Assistance in Northeast Nigeria

FHI 360 is serving over 55, 000 internally displaced persons (IDPs) who have been driven from their homes by conflict and destruction wrought by Boko Haram insurgents across the northeast. Since February 2017, FHI 360's crisis response team has been supporting IDPs in three communities, Dikwa, Ngala, and Banki, in Borno state.

Together with hundreds of community volunteers, local nurses, midwives and water engineers, FHI 360 staff are providing displaced Nigerians with life-saving health screenings, medications, treatment, nutrition services, psycho-social support, safer water sources, and hygiene promotions to improve their living conditions during the crisis.

Our approach in Borno State integrates urgent services with behavior-change programs designed to help people meet their basic needs, manage the unique challenges of their lives during the crisis, and rebuild their communities when it becomes possible to return home. Protection of women from sexual and genderbased violence is key to our approach, and our program provides physical safe space locations where women receive targeted counseling, individualized case management, health services, treatment, and social support. Today, with support from the U.S. Office of Foreign Disaster Assistance, FHI 360 is rapidly scaling the number of people whose needs will be met by our services in partnership with a local community health foundation, the state Ministry of Health, the United Nations, and other international organizations. As more basic needs are met, our work is expanding to new geographies and is incorporating nutrition and food security elements into programming.

As a global actor, FHI 360 is committed to drawing upon our depth and breadth of experience building local capacities and evidence for long-term development solutions. We apply lessons learned from our experience in international development work to create pathways for crisis affected people to initiate recovery and build resilient communities post-crisis.
