Health Centre Committees (HCCs) are a group of individuals elected from communities to represent community interests at primary health care level. They encourage direct engagement of communities in health facility activities and are a means through which community participation can be integrated to achieve a sustainable people centred health system. Well-functioning HCCs help improve health facility policy implementation, oversight and accountability to communities. Mhuri/ Imuli works to strengthen HCCs' MNCH orientation

PROCESS


- 1.Baseline survey of 47 HCCs
- 2. Definition of higher level functions that support MNCH, in line with the Public Health Act (PHA) of 2018

LESSONS LEARNT

- 1. There is need for training of all HCC members on their roles and responsibilities, and to enforce tenures
- 2. The standard roles for HCCs in the 2018 PHA are broad and require customization at health centre level to enhance programmatic
